Introducing Holly Hapke, Director of Research Development

Dr. Holly Hapke is the Director of Research Development for the School of Social Sciences and the School of Social Ecology. She is available to provide CPIP a wide range of support (to individual faculty and research teams) such as:

- Identify funding opportunities.
- Grant Proposal Development (project conceptualization and proposal framing, feedback on draft proposals, budget development, supporting documents, Letters of Intent and preliminary proposals, interpretation of feedback on unsuccessful proposals).
- Interdisciplinary research project and proposal development.
- Communication with funding agency program officers.
- Connect researchers with editing and other proposal preparation resources on campus.
- Assist with Broader Impacts and Community Outreach and Engagement.
- Work with University Advancement offices to coordinate proposals to corporations and foundations.
- Grant proposal writing workshops and seminars.
- Other assistance as needed.

Dr. Hapke is a broadly trained geographer and interdisciplinary social scientist who has conducted research on rural economic and community development, fisheries and food production systems, gender, migration and transnational immigration, technological change, agricultural policy, and impacts of flood. Prior to arriving at UCI, she was on the faculty at East Carolina University for 22 years and served as a rotating program director at the National Science Foundation from 2014-2017.
